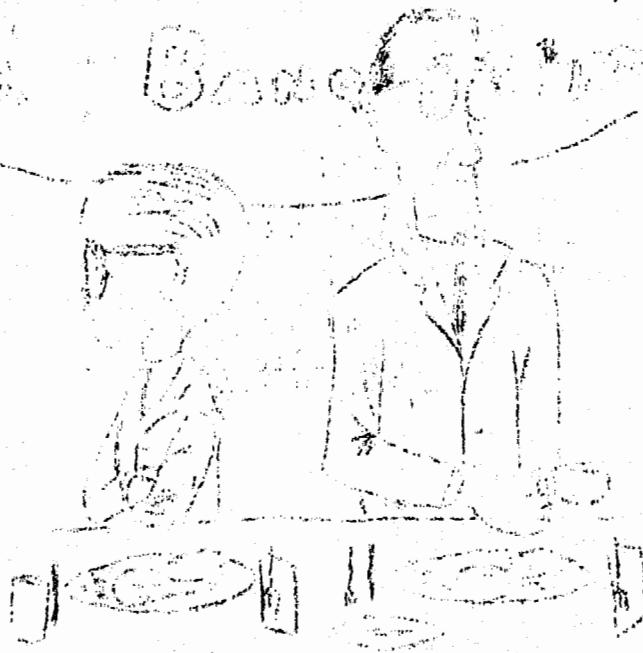

ARE YOU AN ACTIVE MEMBER?

Each year a number of young men are initiated into the Order of DeMolay, never to be seen again after they have received both their degrees and are in the position to enjoy and benefit from the DeMolay way-of-life. This occurrence is not unique among organizations, but it is always disturbing to watch since the voluntary withdrawal from participation is almost invariably made without an understanding of the values and worthwhile association that awaits each new member. Certainly the Chapter is not the worst sufferer; it is the member who does not stick it out long enough to find what DeMolay has for him!

I would guess that the most common reason for becoming an inactive member is feeling like a stranger in a new crowd of associates, yet this is inconsistent with everything that is taught to a new member during the ceremonies of his introduction into DeMolay, that he is now a brother in a vast brotherhood of God-loving respectable young men. And since when is a brother a stranger? Another reason I feel contributes to the staying-away of newly initiated members is their confusion or lack of understanding of some of the ceremonies through which they moved. Confusion breeds fear or apprehension which is often avoided rather than attempting to understand it better. Yet if one hides rather than trying to clear up the confusion, he will never benefit from the truths and precepts that he is avoiding.

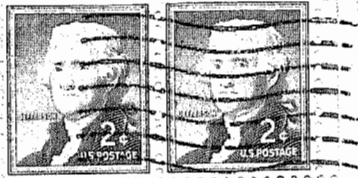
